RSSAC recent actions (Beijing meeting, 7 Nov. 2010)

- Last call on Root Scaling comment
 - Submitted to the Board on Nov. 30
 - Foresees no problem with staff-committed limit of up to 1000 new gTLDs per year
 - Undertakes a future project to identify parameters that define desired service for the DNS root
- Consideration of ICANN Board Risk Committee request
 - Asked for public statement on root server capacity specifically with regards to root scaling
 - Discussion/review of a draft comment, not yet final

RSSAC Recent Actions, cont'd

- Agree to consider moving at least one meeting per year to occur adjacent to ICANN meeting
 - RSSAC has always met in conjunction with IETF
 - Wider engagement is possible by varying this
- Liaison directed to investigate logistical support from ICANN
- Framework and tentative schedule for interim meetings adopted
