Steps in Strategic Plan process

- Process began with community exchange in Singapore
- Received community Input on formulation of the plan in July
- Held internal brainstorm sessions, reviewed and updated strategic metrics
- SO/AC consultations
- Posted draft <u>2012-2015 Strategic Plan</u> for 45 day public comment period



Development of Metrics


Objectives: Broad, general areas of review. These generally reflect the end goals based on the mission of a function.

Criteria: Specific areas of accomplishment that satisfy major divisions of responsibility within a function.

Measures: Metrics designed to drive improvement and characterize progress made under each criteria. These are specific goals based on individual expected work outputs.



Sample Metrics - Number and trend of ICANN Fellowships and the related increase and participation in ICANN processes



Metrics - DNS Stability and Security

- Contract enforcement of TLD uptime SLAs
- Number of DNSSEC TLD signings and broadly adopted by end of plan period
- Number of IPv6 awareness raising engagements in which ICANN participates
- Appropriate percentage of the ICANN budget dedicated to DNS stability, security and resiliency



Metrics - Core Operations including IANA

- EFQM assessment demonstrating improvement over time
- RPKI deployment within the period of the plan
- 2011 implementation of a new ICANN finance information technology system
- Develop and publish additional metrics and reporting of contractual compliance performance

Metrics - Competition, consumer trust & choice

- Launch of the new gTLD program and timely processing of applications
- Measure effectiveness of Rights Protection Mechanisms in New gTLD Program
- Launch and timely progress of the Whois program enhancements, especially to address internationalized data
- IDNA 2008 protocol adoption



Metrics - A healthy Internet eco- system

- Timely completion of the Affirmation Reviews
- Formalized cross-stakeholder participation process in the multi-stakeholder model
- Number and trend of ICANN Fellowships and the related increase and participation in ICANN processes
- Effective process for ALAC feedback to Board
