## Discussion Paper on the creation of non-binding best practices to address the abusive registrations of domain names




### Background



- In its Final Report, the Registration Abuse Policies (RAP) Working Group recommended 'the creation of nonbinding best practices to help registrars and registries address the illicit use of domain names'.
- At its meeting on 3 February 2011, the GNSO Council requested ICANN Staff to prepare a discussion paper on this topic

#### Status



- Staff organized a workshop in Singapore to get community input on this topic
- Discussion paper submitted to the GNSO Council for consideration on 28 September 2011
- GNSO Council to consider next steps, including possibility of opening public comment forum

#### **Discussion Paper**





- Scope considered within ICANN's mission and core values
- Considers issues such as:
  - What makes a practice a best practice
  - Identification and/or creation
  - Defining non-binding nature
  - ICANN's role
  - Resources and process
  - Maintenance, review, promotion and dissemination
  - Cost, benefit, funding, incentives

#### **Discussion Paper (continued)**



- Preliminary inventory of current or proposed best practices
- Proposed next steps:
  - Creation of a GNSO Working Group to establish the framework for best practices
  - Creation of a Cross-Community
    Technical Group to propose candidate
    best practices to address the abusive
    registration of domain names

### Next Steps



- GNSO Council to consider whether to put out discussion paper for public comment prior to deciding on next steps
- Next steps should also include consideration of RAP recommendation on Meta Issue: Collection and Dissemination of Best Practices
