Terminology

- PUSH Model
 - Losing registrar initiates domain transfer
 - Gaining registrar explicitly accepts
 - or has an auto-accept option set

- DNSSEC Enabled
 - Registrars must indicate if they can handle DS records

DNSSEC part of the Transfer Policy

- If the domain is signed, losing registrar is DNSSEC able.
 - Or we wouldn't have the DS record for that domain.
- If the gaining registrar is DNSSEC able.
 - We keep the DS records intact.
- If the gaining registrar is not DNSSEC able.
 - We remove the DS records in transfer.

Consequences

- Removing the DS records causes a domain to be 'Un-Signed'
 - Still resolvable, but not DNSSEC signed anymore
- Keeping the original DS record requires that the DNS operator does not change, hence solely a registrar change.
- If the DNS operator moves as well, the operator must, through the registrar, update the DS record set.
