


The anatomy of a domain name

Terminology clarifications

- gTLD = generic Top-Level Domain
 - extension, label, **string**, suffix...
 - Series of characters that make up part of your Internet address
- ccTLD country code Top-Level Domain
- IDN = Internationalized Domain Names
 - Domain name represented by local language characters, or letter equivalents



IDNs: What are they?


IDNs are domain names represented by local language characters.


IDNs: When did they start?

- November 2009: IDN Fast Tack Process launched
- May 2010: First IDN ccTLDs delegated in the root zone

The New gTLD Program: What is it?



 An initiative that will enable the introduction of unlimited generic top-level domain names (in both ASCII & IDN) into the domain name space



New gTLDs: Why expand the top level?


- To increase choice and competition in the domain name space
- To create a platform for innovation
- To incorporate character sets such as Chinese, Arabic, Cyrillic or any non-Latin alphabet at the top-level



New gTLD quick stats

- Total number of applications: 1930
- Applications for IDN strings: 116
- Applications for community-based strings: 84
- Applications for geographic names: 66
- 230 strings w/more than 1 applicant
- Financial support applications: 3
- Withdrawals: 7
- Objections filed: 0
- Application comments submitted: 6687
