Hamburg - summary

1. Cross Community Involvement

- ccTLDs and gTLDs – stronger connection
- ccTLDs need to be explained clearly across ICANN
- High turnover in the GAC – ongoing education

2. Trust & Credibility

- Awareness of emerging technologies
- Predictability of the ccNSO

3. Collaboration, Engagement, Community

- Buddy System
- Mentoring
- Knowledge transfer (ccNSO library)



3. ccNSO Relevance to Wider ICANN Community

- Similar contributions as Cross Community Involvement

4. Inclusion

- Similar contributions as Collaboration, Engagement & Community

5. The value of the ccNSO to a ccTLD

- High diversity group with one voice towards ICANN, IANA.
- Worldwide reach
- Collaboration for the benefit of the ccTLDs

Is the suggestion within ccNSO's remit?

- If not within ccNSO's remit, no further action will be taken
 - Example: Bilateral relation ccTLD Manager and national Government
- If within remit: what to do with suggestion?



If suggestion is in ccNSO's remit

- Is suggestion within scope of work of ccNSO Council, existing Committee or Working Group?
 - The group will be informed and asked to consider if & how it intends to include it as a work item.
 - The group should report back to the community through the Council.
 - Examples:
 - ccTLDs and gTLDs – stronger connection
 - Council exploring relation with RySG
 - Knowledge transfer (ccNSO library)
 - DNS Abuse Library (DASC) &
 - Universal Acceptance Library (UAC)



If suggestion is in ccNSO's remit

- If suggestion is not within the scope of any group
 - The Council will explore the suggestion further and report back to the community if and how the various suggestions have been incorporated in the portfolio of activities of the ccNSO.
 - Examples:
 - Need for a formal onboarding process of new members
 - Buddy and/or Mentoring system
