The context

- Internet governance is at an inflection point
 - Global Digital Compact
 - WSIS+20
- The multistakeholder approach to Internet governance is at risk
- The multistakeholder approach to Internet governance is not set in stone
- Those who care must engage to defend it

The gap

- In this context, there is a clear need for the Internet technical community to be active
- But no functioning mechanism for coordination of the Internet technical community
- Due diligence ---> forming up the Coalition
- It is “a” technical community coalition
