GOAL? To enable ccTLD operators worldwide to collaboratively strengthen their incident response capabilities



TLD-OPS Disaster Recovery and Business Continuity Playbook (BC/DR)

- tools to help a ccTLD conduct its own tabletop exercise

Available in Arabic, Chinese (Simplified), French, English, Spanish and Russian.

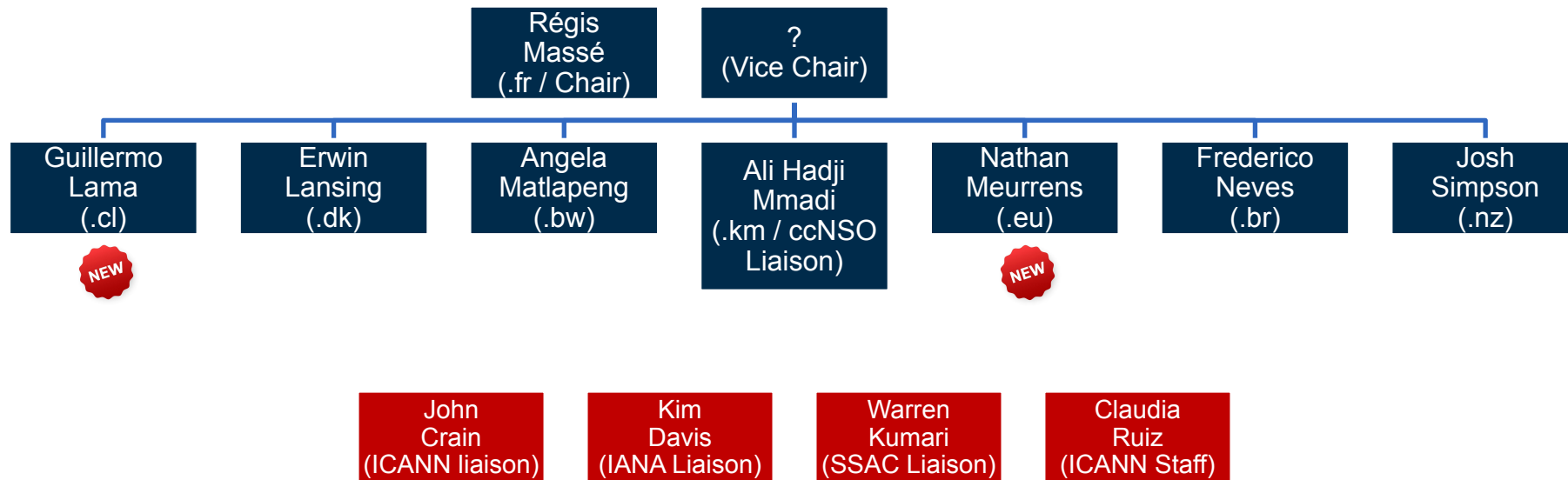

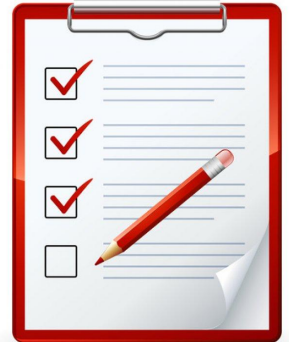
The evolution of the Standing Committee

This section provides an overview of ICANN Operations funding and expenses, which are a part of Total ICANN.

4.1 FY26 Budget Versus FY25 Adopted Budget

USD in Millions	FY26 Budget	FY25 Adopted Budget	Notes
Funding	\$142	\$145	FY26 budget does not include impact of projected fee increases; reflects half a fiscal year of SSR contribution as existing contractual terms expire in December 2025
Personnel	(84)	(90)	Lower Personnel costs in FY26 due to lower average FTEs
Non-Personnel Expenses	(53)	(58)	Non-personnel expenses include savings from cost saving initiatives being carried out during FY25 that will continue in FY26
Contingency	(8)	(5)	FY26 Contingency budgeted at \$7.5M, about 5% of ICANN Operations costs
Cost Savings Initiatives	3	8	Both years reflect cost savings needed to balance budgets
Total Expenses	\$142	\$145	
Excess/(Deficit)	0	(2-7)	- Deficit projected for FY25 as full year impact of all cost savings initiatives will not be fully realized due to timing of implementation - FY26 financials will be balanced as further cost savings are being implemented and fee increase not included

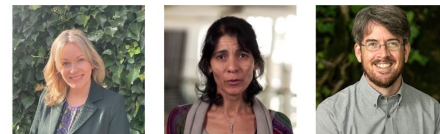
