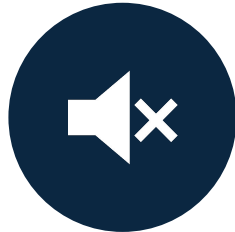

Process to Communicate Revisions to the Annual Draft Plans

Draft Framework for Revisions to the Operating Plan and Budget

- ICANN's annual planning process initiates several months prior to the start of the fiscal year and includes stakeholder engagement and a Public Comment proceeding
- ICANN is committed to transparency and accountability throughout its planning process
- Throughout the planning process, ICANN may periodically evaluate whether any of the assumptions included in the Plans should be updated
 - This is important given how far in advance of adoption the detailed plans are developed
- In some cases, the latest information available may result in updates to either funding and/or expenses set out in the Plans that are presented to the Board for adoption
- With this draft framework, ICANN is committed to ensuring that all revisions are communicated in a transparent manner

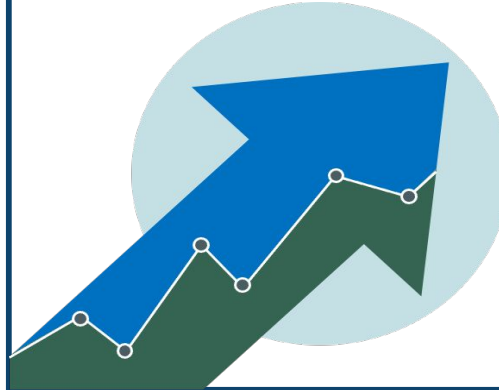

Why Progress Measurement and Reporting

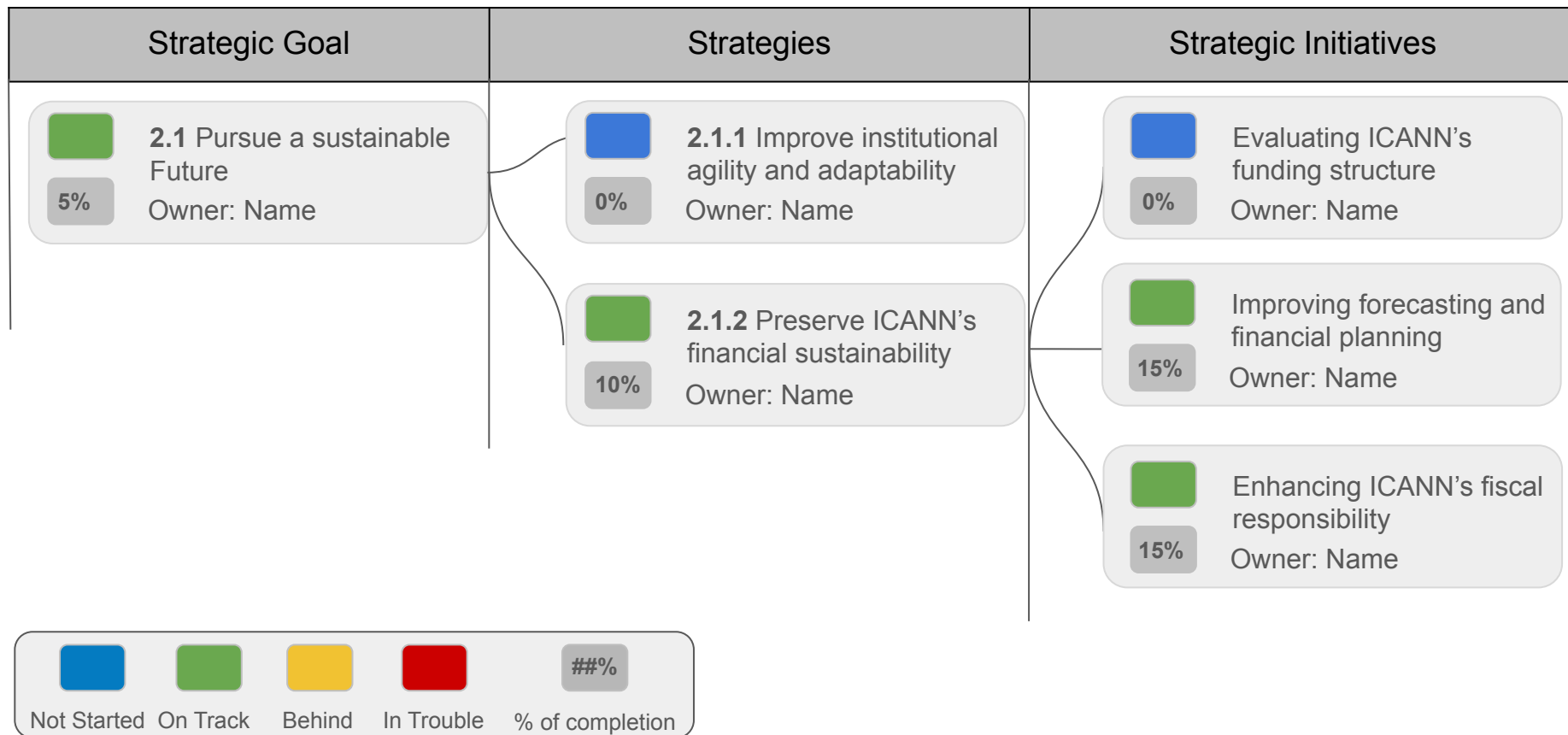
- The objective of the **Progress Measurement and Reporting project** is to establish a consistent approach to ensure accountability and visibility / transparency of achievements of the Strategic Plan and Operating Plan
- By doing so, progress updates can be consistent across functional teams, making it easy to track outcomes and demonstrate overall performance
- With a standardized reporting process, it will be easier to:
 - Identify performance trends and gaps in strategic execution
 - Communicate progress effectively to stakeholders
 - Make data-driven decisions to adjust operational priorities or resources in response to Strategic Plan execution

What ICANN is Going to Measure

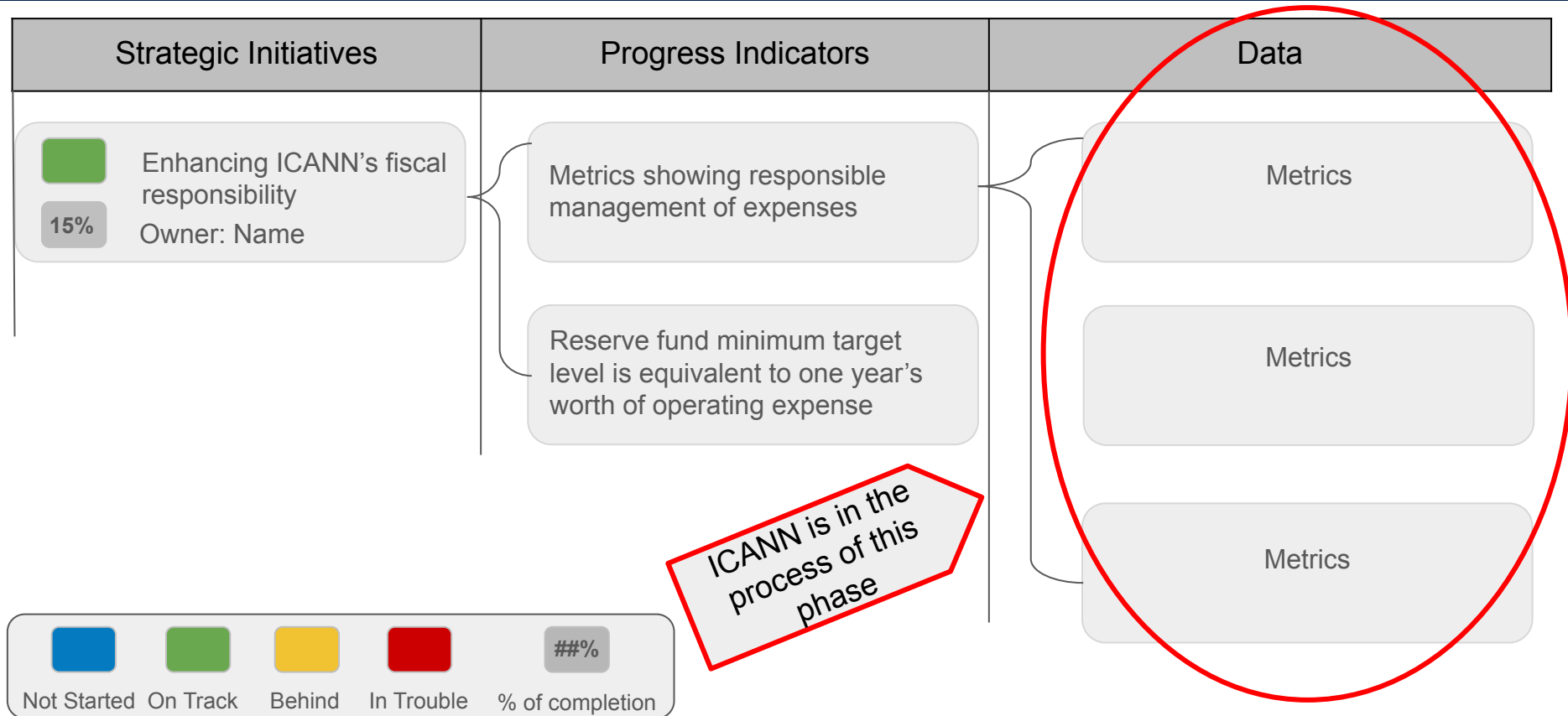
- In the Operating Plan, there are defined **strategic initiatives**, which represent projects / programs to be worked on to achieve the ICANN's Strategic Plan
- The Operating Plan also includes continuing operations to support the achievement of the Mission
- The **strategic initiatives** are the bridge / most direct linkage between the Strategic Plan and the Operating Plan
- ICANN will measure the progress of the Operating Plan and tracking execution activities
 - This approach will demonstrate how day-to-day operations are delivering on our Strategic Plan
 - This linkage will be maintained through a structured reporting process that aligns strategic progress indicators with operational metrics and milestones

What's Accomplished to Date

- To streamline the process of obtaining ICANN SMEs' input, the planning team conducted a thorough review of the Operating Plan and the CEO report to the Board
- ICANN identified and extracted key performance indicators of each function from the Operating Plan and the CEO report, and developed a draft database
- This groundwork was completed to simplify internal review and feedback process - allowing SMEs to focus on validating and refining the most relevant information rather than starting from scratch

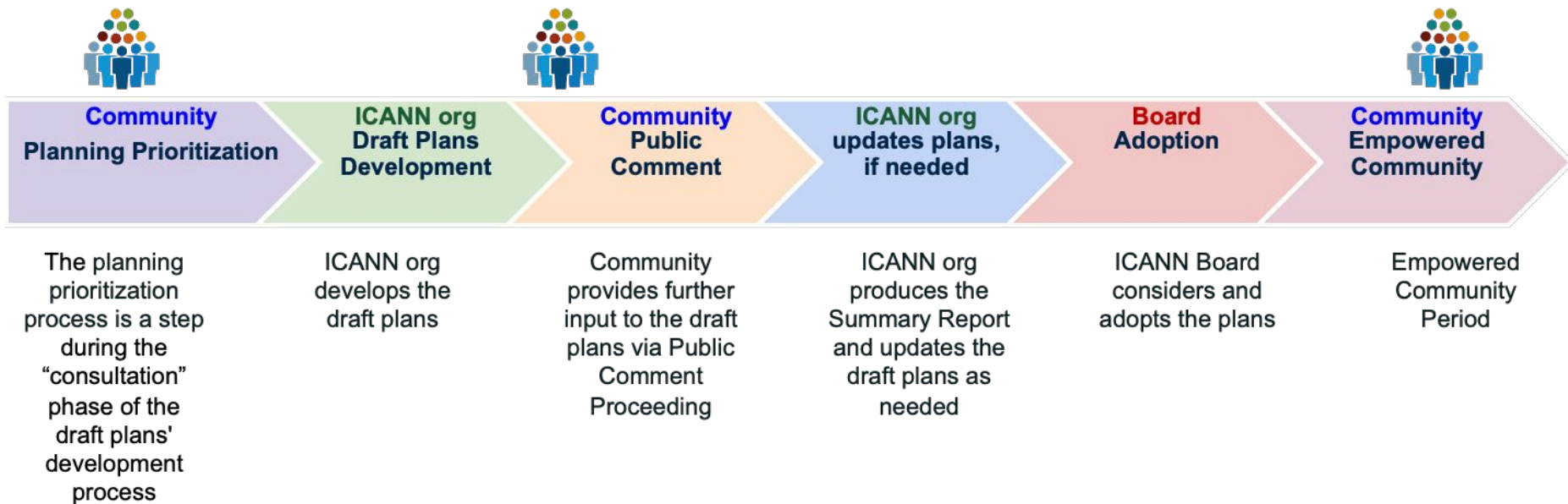

FY26 Financial Update

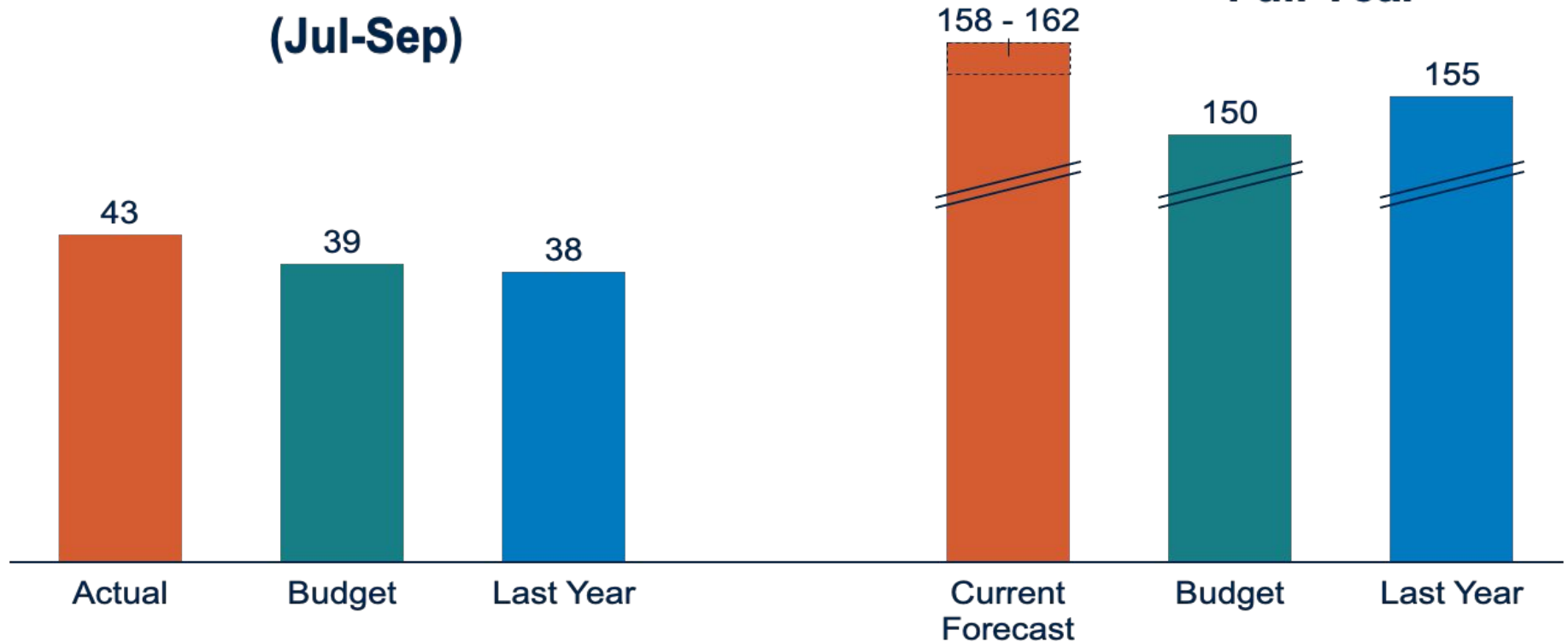
- The FY26 Adopted Budget for ICANN Operations planned for balanced Funding and Expenses of \$150M each
- Forecast assumptions continue to be refined as new information is learned; it is still very early in the fiscal year, and the forecast will update accordingly
- FY26 Funding forecast is projected higher than budget driven by higher than planned domain registrations and number of contracted parties versus the adopted budget assumptions
- FY26 Expenses forecast for ICANN Operations is aligned to FY26 Adopted Budget
- FY26 Expenses forecast for Next Round and Grant Program are also aligned to their respective budgets

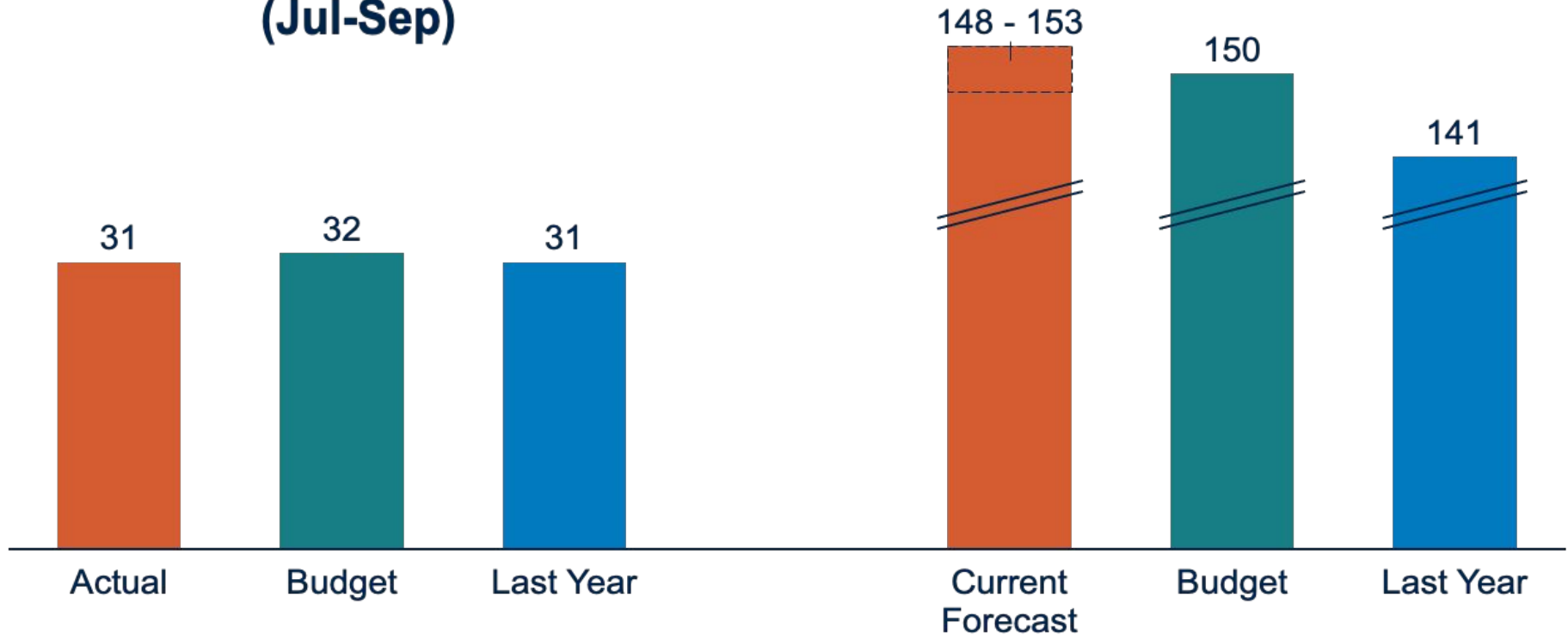


FY26 Operations Expenses Status

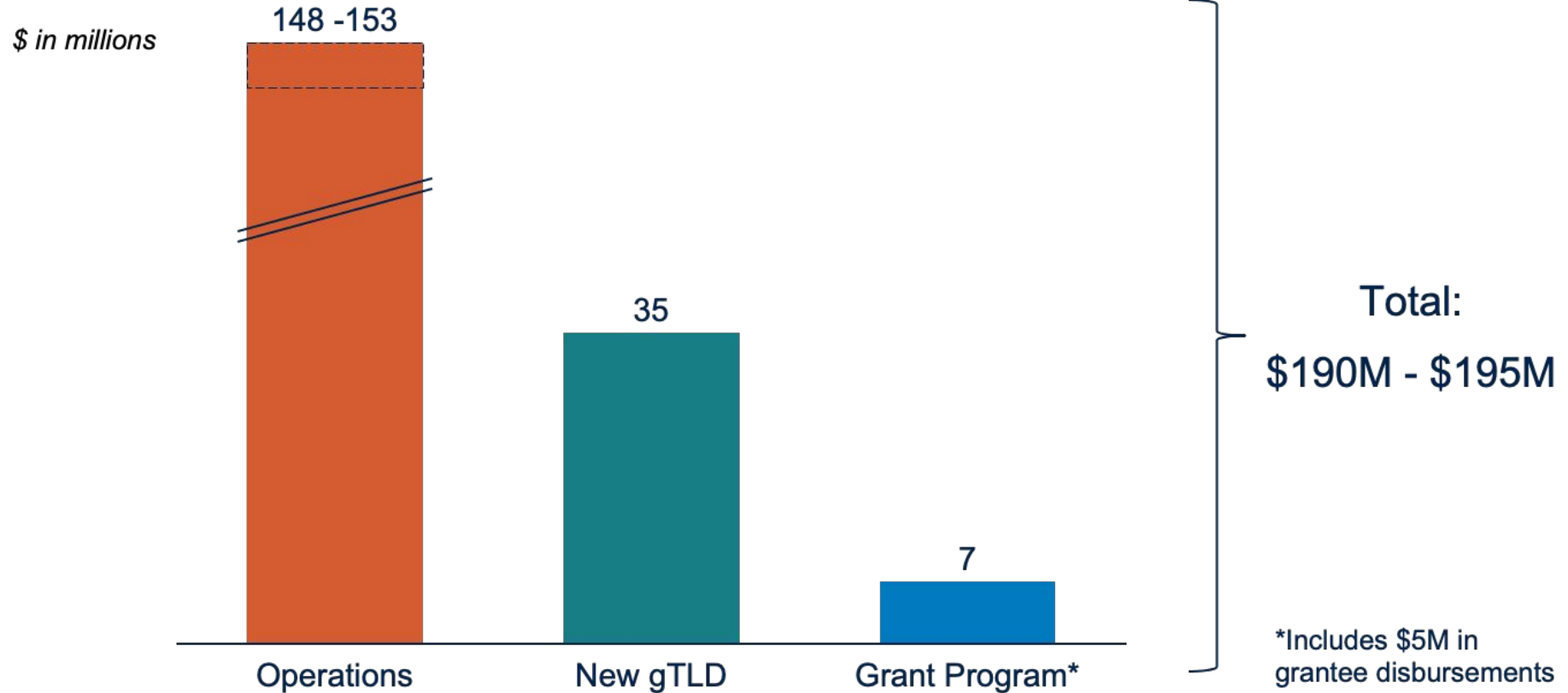

Median 12-month Growth in Domains | European ccTLDs



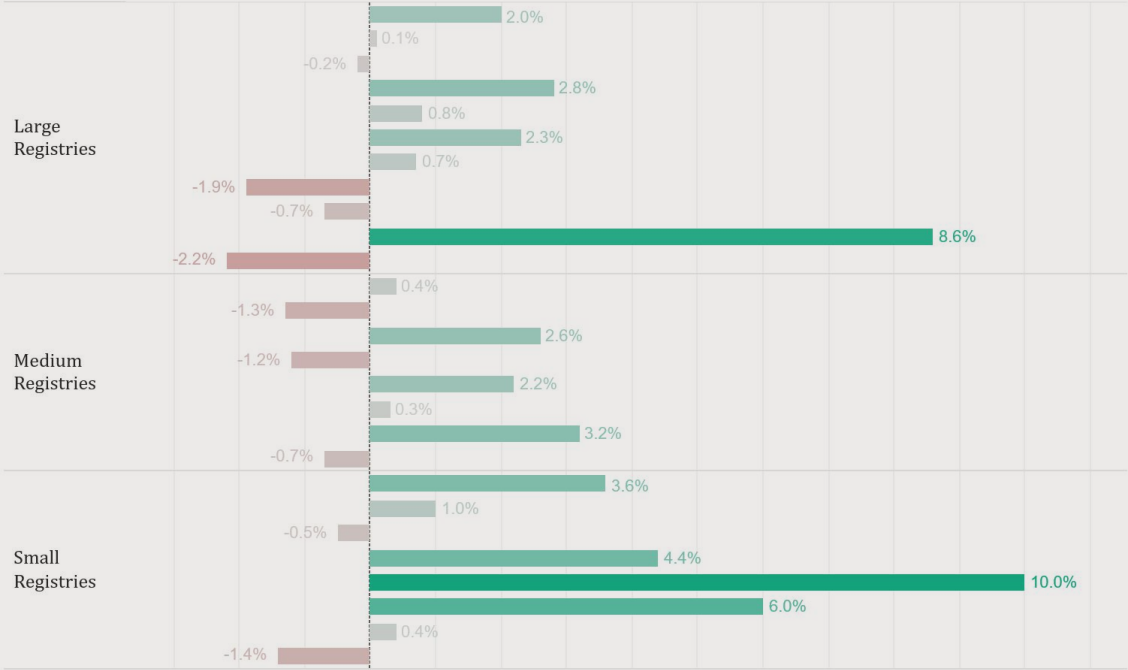

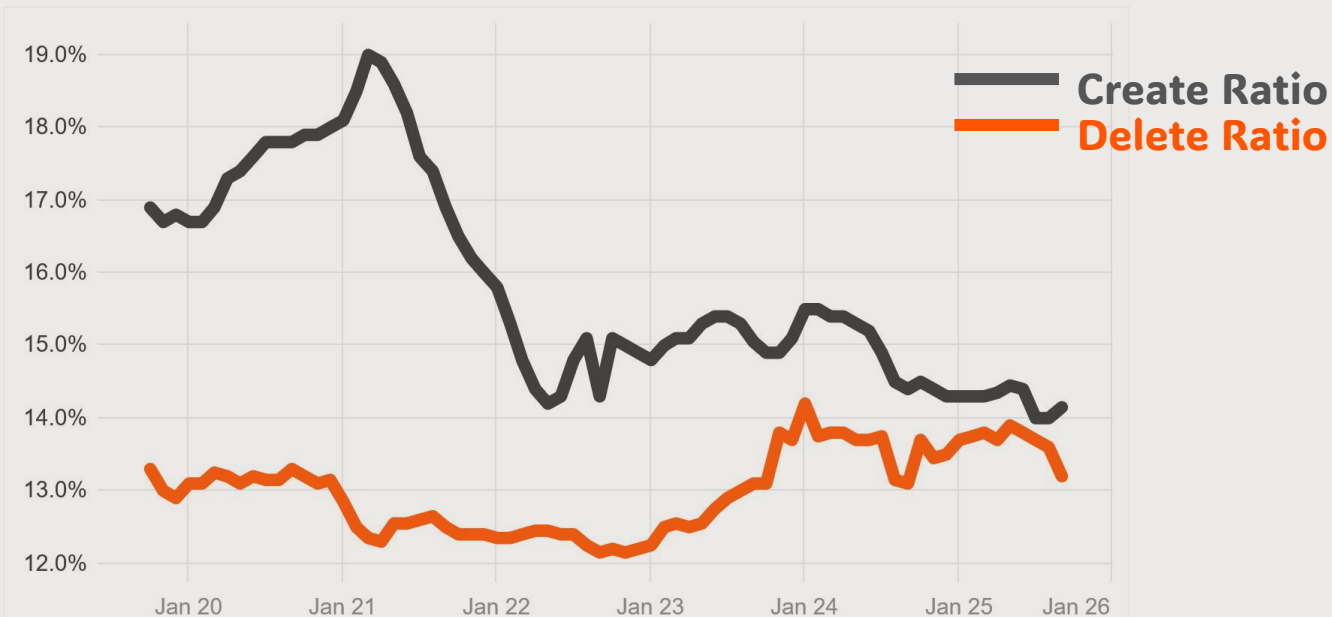

Median Create and Delete Ratio | European ccTLDs

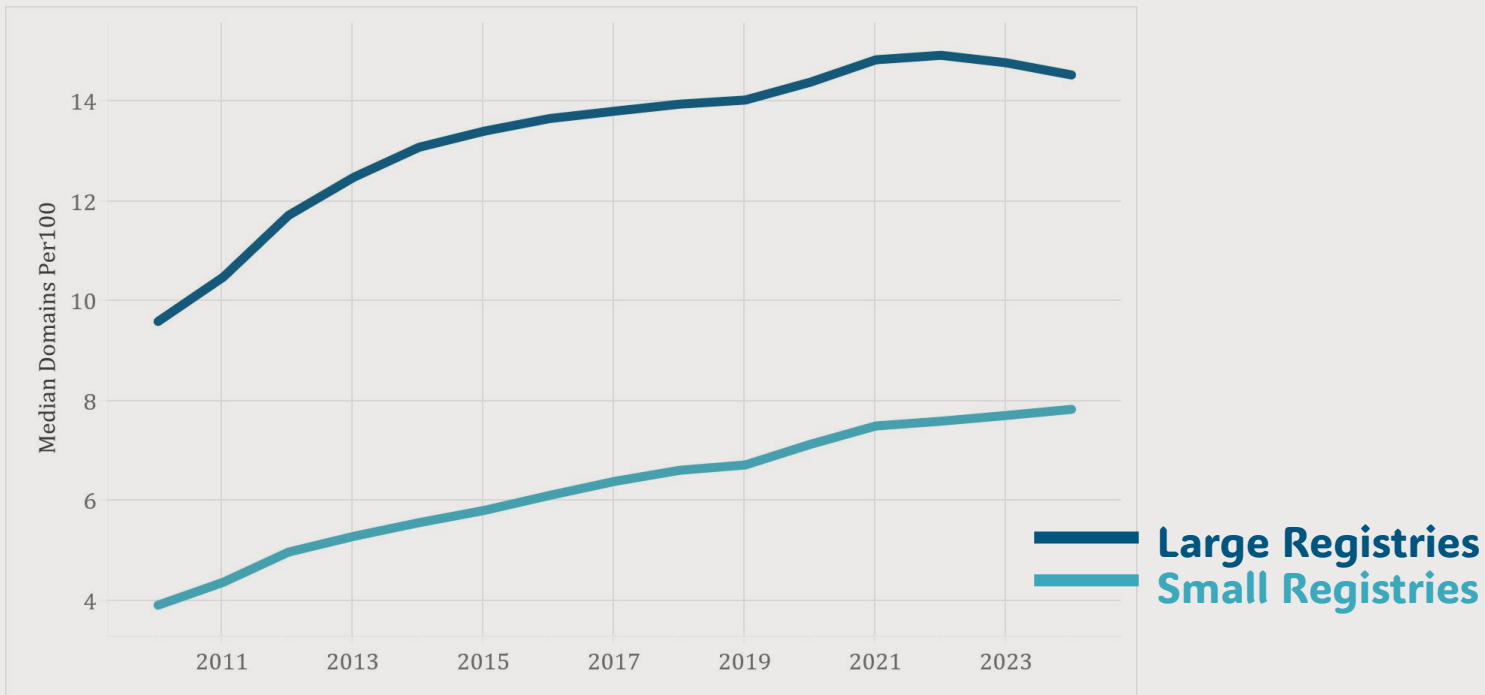

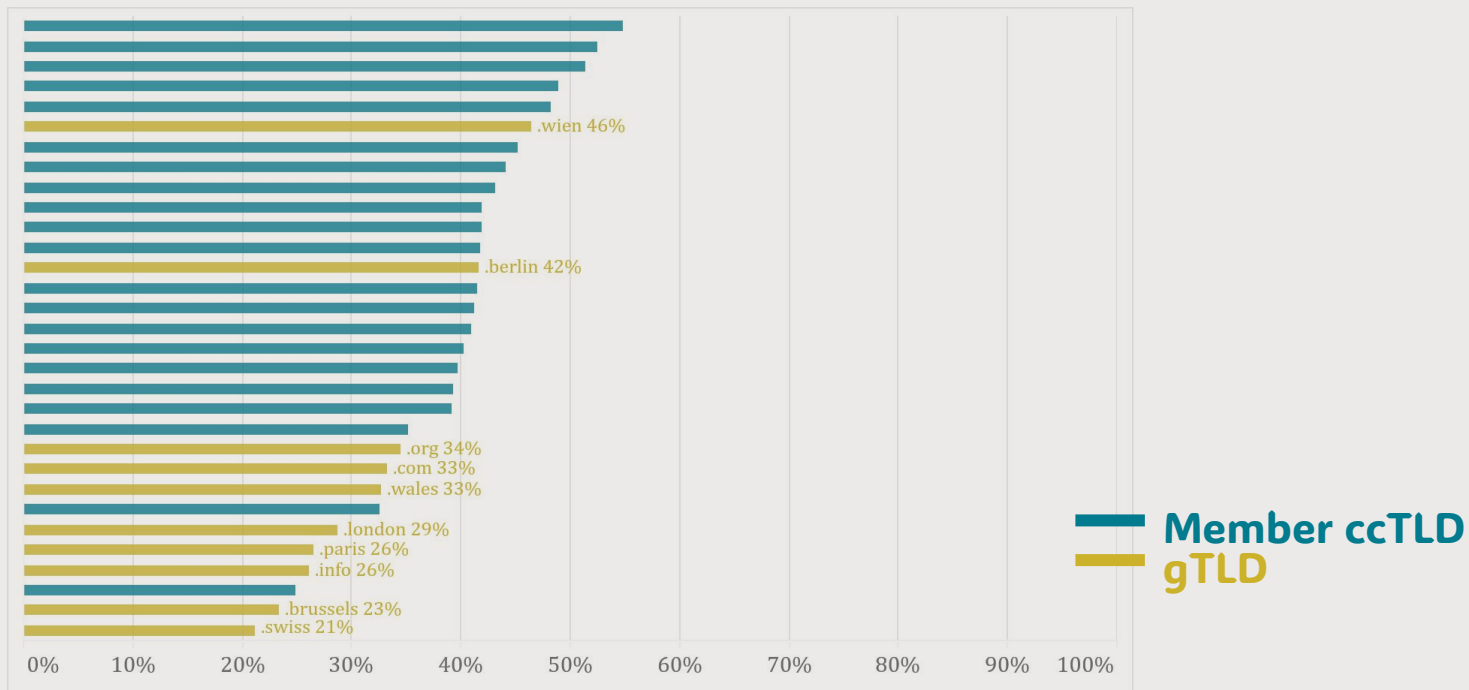

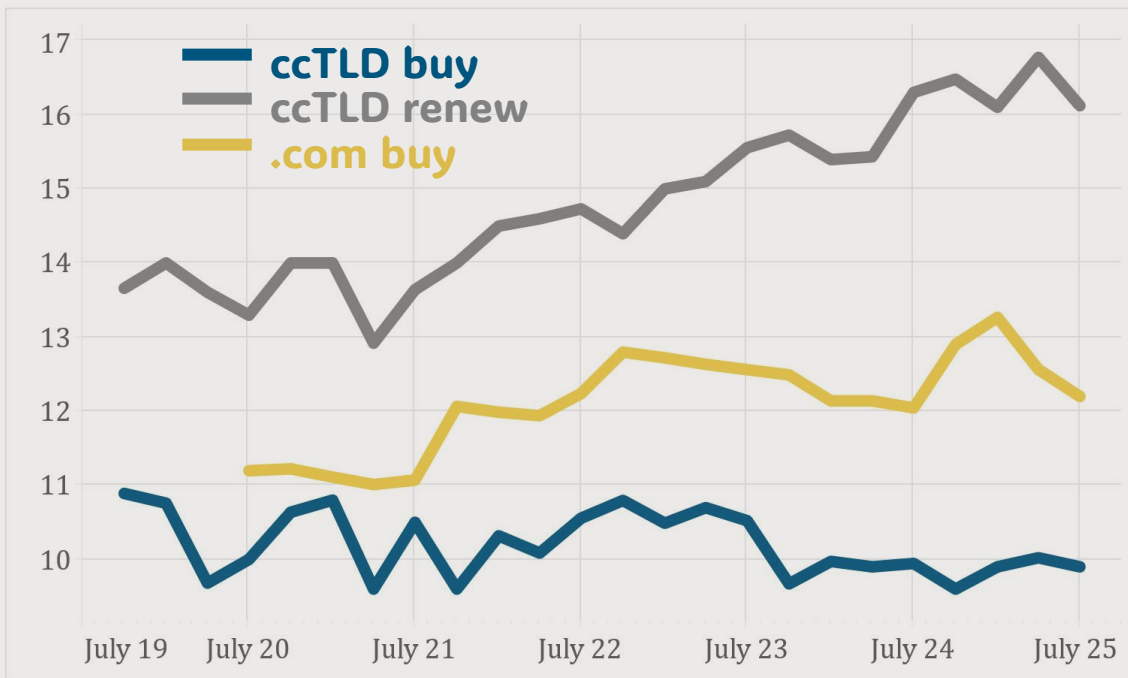

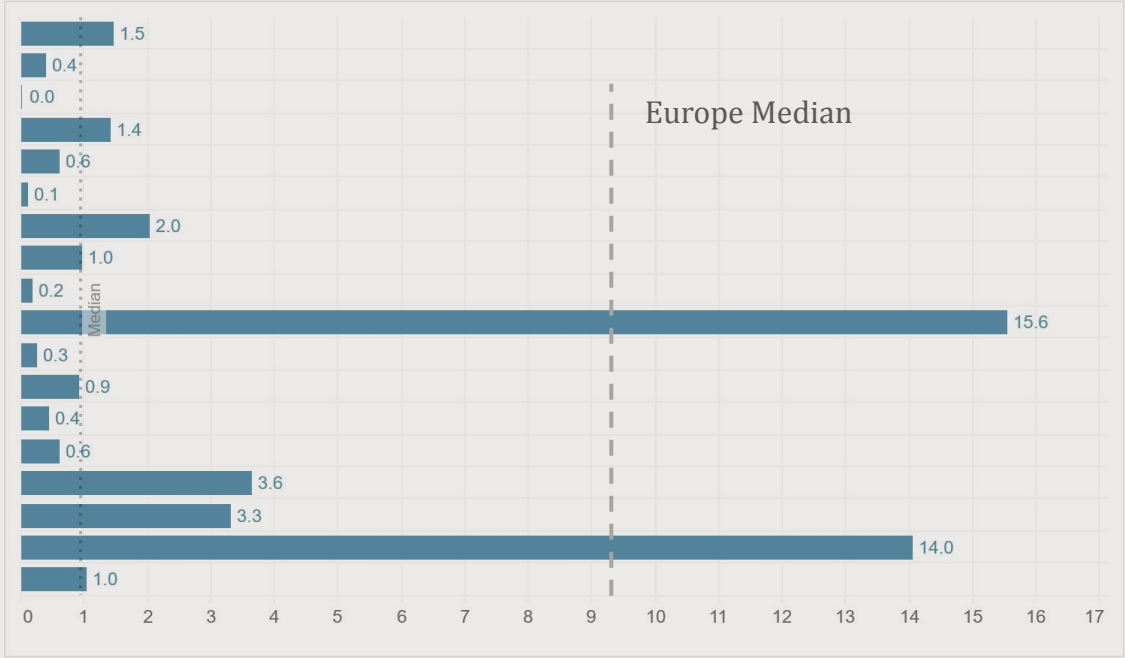

ccTLD domains per 100 population. Sorted by country population descending



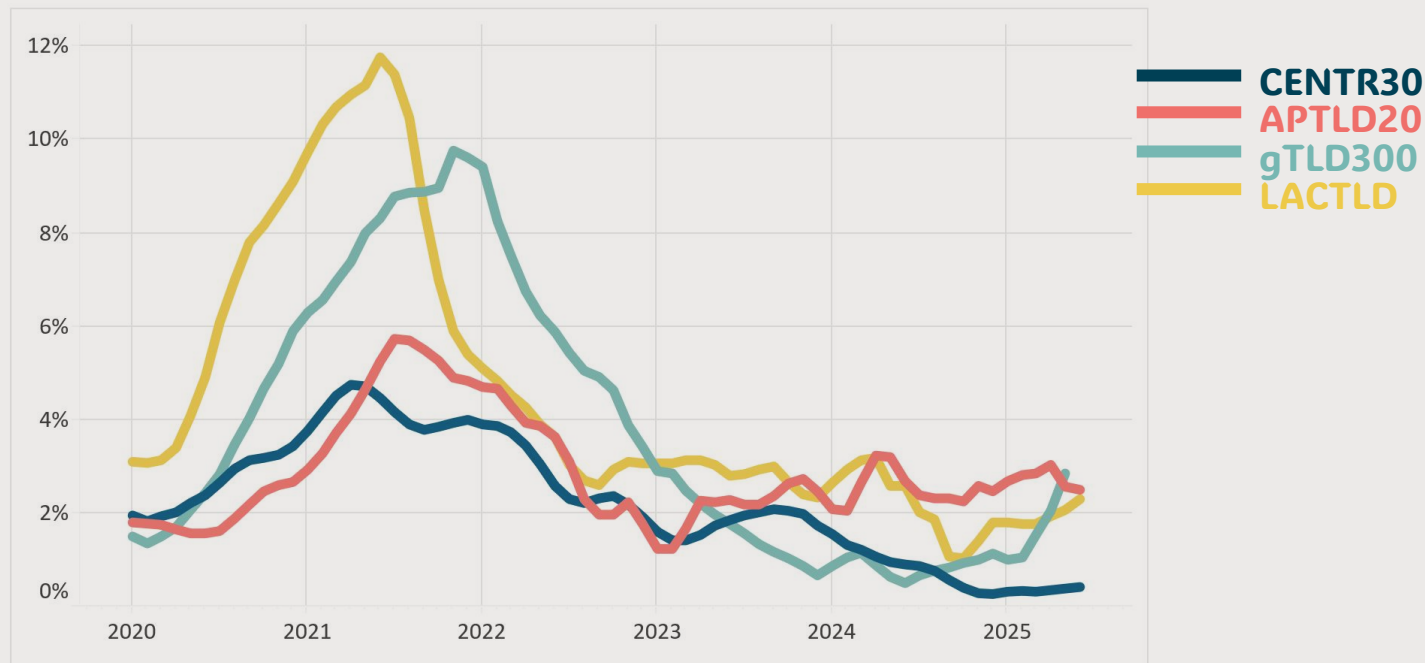

Median 12-month growth in domains by group

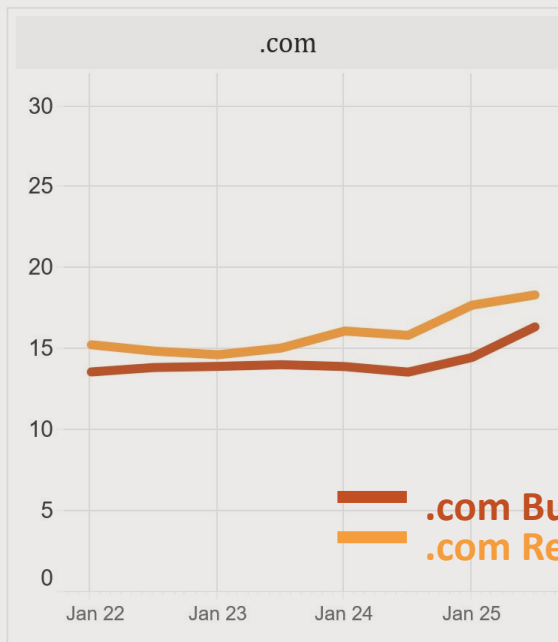
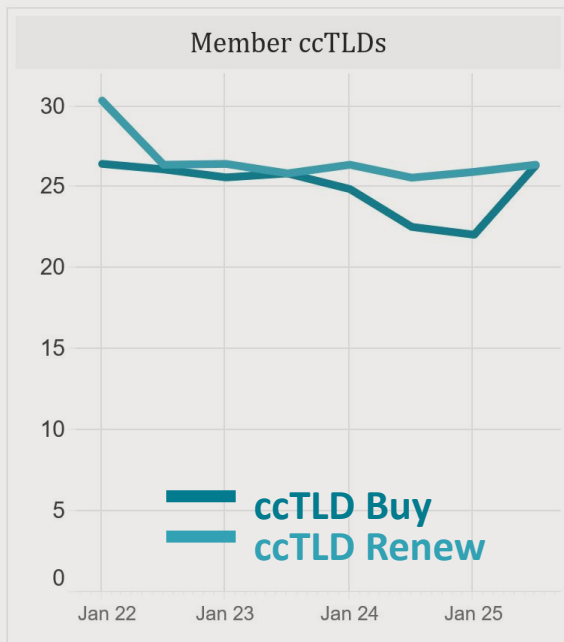

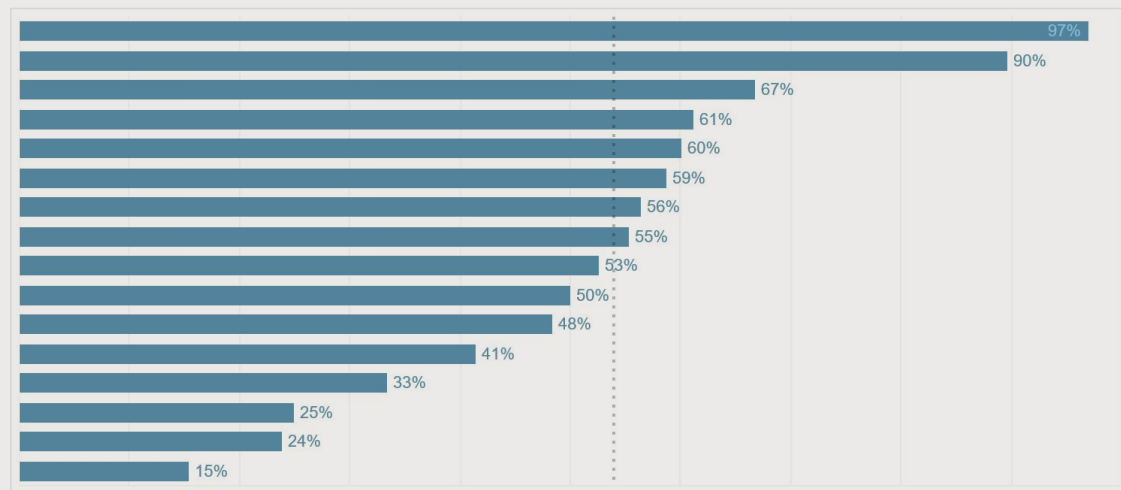

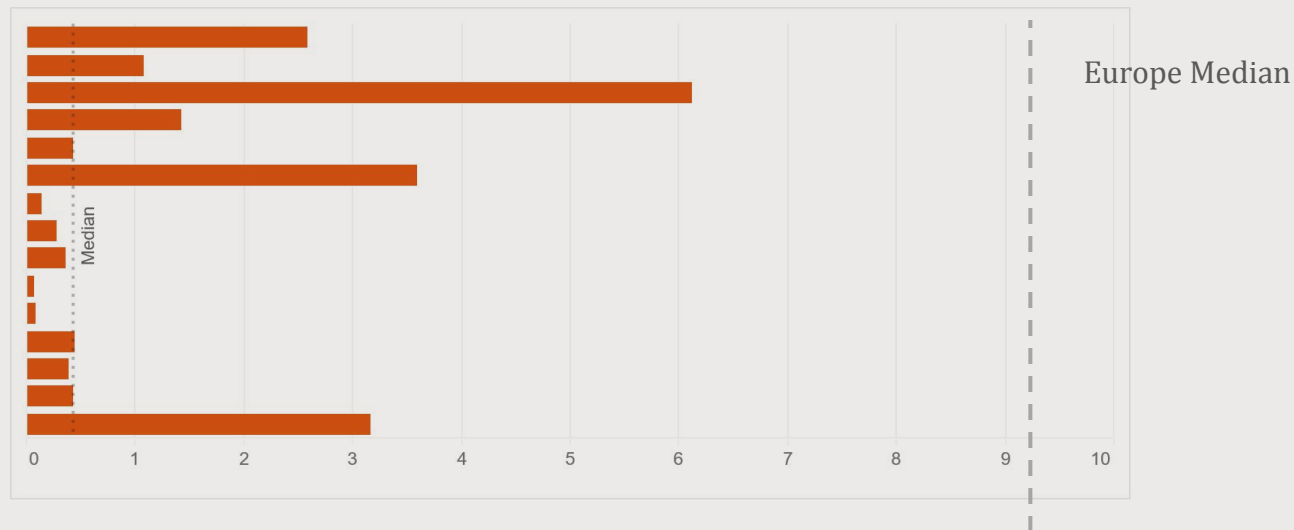

Total ccTLD domains per 100 population by LACTLD member ccTLD

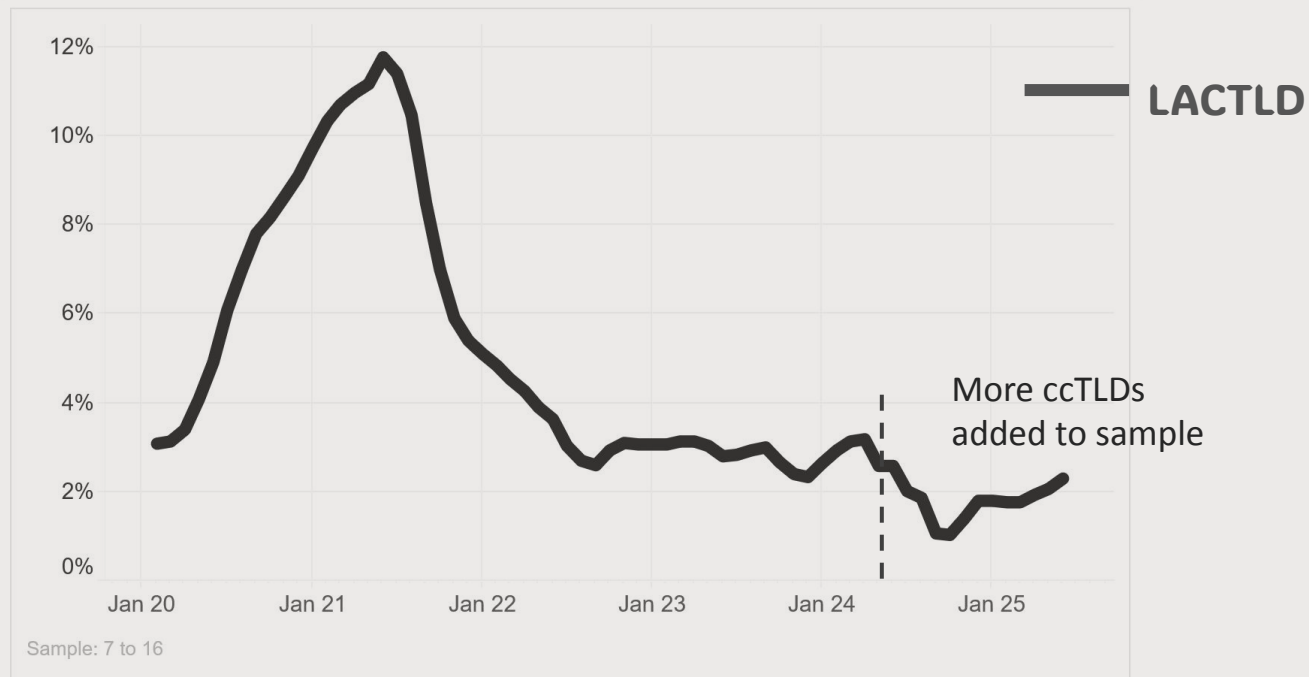

Median 12-month growth in domains | LACTLD ccTLDs

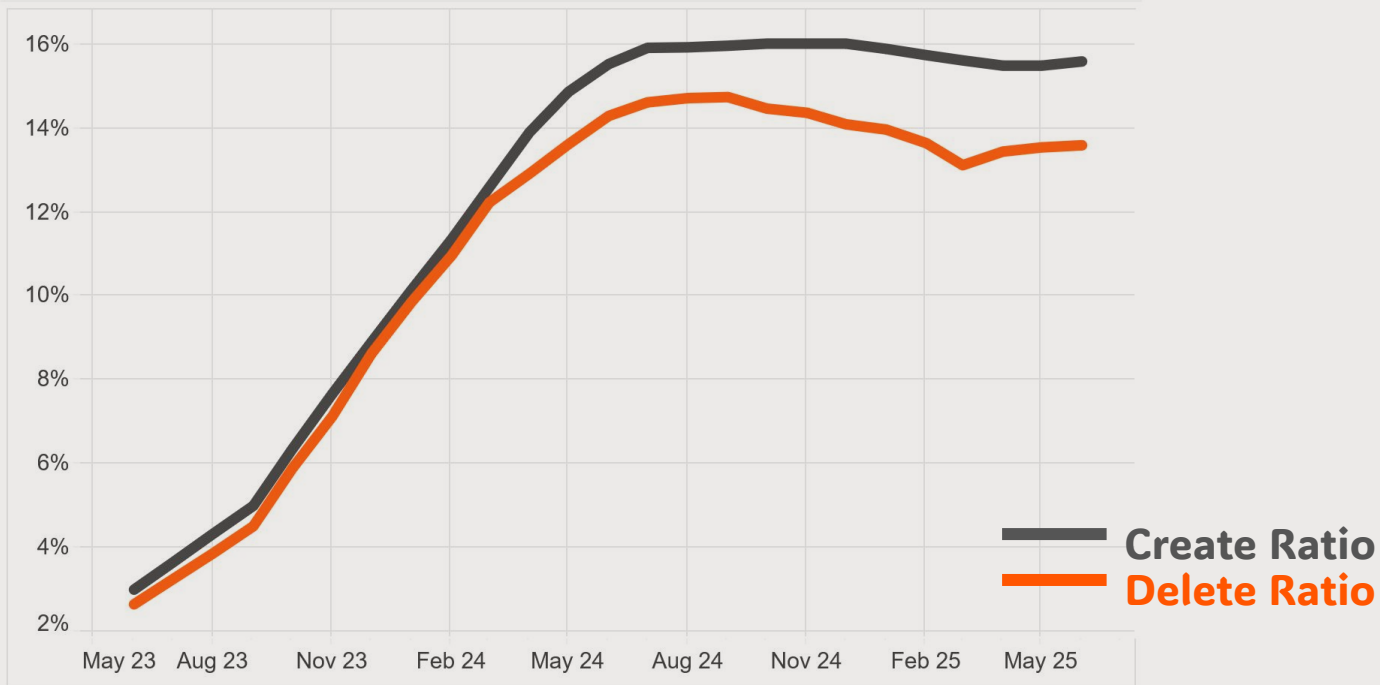

Median create and delete ratios | LACTLD ccTLDs



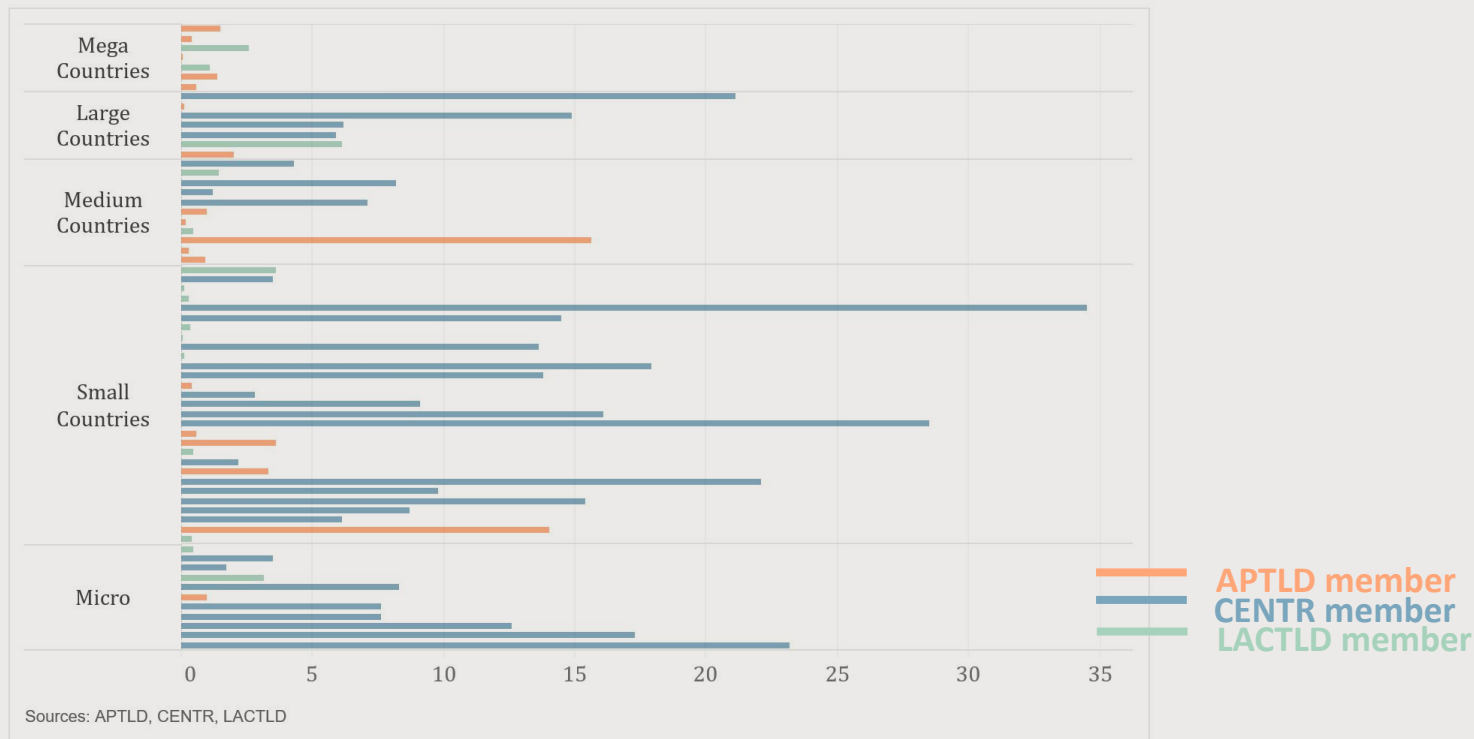

- **Team Work:** Each basket team reviews its topics and presents findings in a webinar.
- **Leadership Role:** Leadership participates in team work and consolidates inputs and circulates the draft for review.
- **Ongoing Coordination:** WhatsApp channel for quick communication - ??
- **Review Step:** Teleconference held to review and refine draft submissions.
