- Hong Kong Internet Registration Corporation Limited (HKIRC) 香港互聯網註冊管理有限公司
 > non-profit-making; non-statutory, member-based
 > 'public' company with a Board of Directors
 > designated by HKSAR Government
 > manage and administer .hk domain names
 > Registry and only registrar
- Hong Kong Domain Name Registration Company Limited (HKDNR) 香港域名註冊有限公司
 ➢ Operating arm of HKIRC
 ➢ Day-to-day administration of .hk domain names

- Physical access control
- Computer access control

- InfoSec compliance statement with vendors
- Reporting security incident
- Incident response procedures



Process - Security features of our processes

- DNS records generation reconciliation
 - -Check the DNS zone files generation are complete and correct before use
 - •Compare zone files and database
- DNS servers records dig check
 - -Check the records are correctly loaded and are timely transferred to all DNS servers
 - •Compare DNS servers dig results with database
- Web patrol for registration website

–Check the registration website integrity and functions are healthy

•Access the website to check that content has not been unduly modified

Test the key functions of the registration system

- Physical access control
 - -Passcard system

 - -Enable and review access logs

 - -account and password

- Change control
 - -Change approval process
 - -Enable and review change logs

Risk Assessment and Security Audits

- Risk assessment once a year
 -Any new business objectives?
 -Any new risks? New threats?
 -Reassess gaps
- External audit once every two to three years
 Conduct audit by an independent party

Background

- HKIRC was designated by the HKSARG in 2002 to administer the '.hk' domain names
- After 5 years of operations, HKSARG felt that it was a good time to review the institutional framework based on the experience gained within that 5 years.
- HKSARG engaged an external consultant to conduct the review in 2006. Key stakeholders were contacted by the consultant to solicit their views.
- The findings and recommendations of the consultant were put up for public consultation in May 2007.
- Based on the submissions received, HKSARG was of the view that the public was in general supportive of the changes proposed in the consultation paper.
- HKIRC started to implement the changes in early 2008 and, in particular, to implement the new membership classes and Board structure by the AGM in 2008.
