- Sponsored community:
 - Parties that wish to store contact information in the DNS
- Eligibility criteria:
 - Eligibility determined by usage
 - Can participate: those who publish NAPTR records
 - Cannot participate: those who intend to use the .tel domain name for a website.



Modified SRS logic

- Authority checker process
 - Queries DNS servers
 - Checks presence of a NAPTR record
 - If zone complies with the AUP publishes the domain on the root .tel nameserver



Exclusion criteria: Implementation

- Nameservers run by contracted parties
- Mandatory provisioning system (TelHosting)
