Trademark Clearinghouse	Data repository offering authentication and validation services for trademark data	RFI open through 25 November 11
Independent Objector (IO)	Objector to file and prosecute objections in public interest	RFP expected mid-November – combined with recruiting activity
Uniform Rapid Suspension (URS)	Provider(s) to administer URS complaints re: registered names	RFP expected mid-November

Applicant Support

Subtitle

Board Resolution – Singapore

- \$2 Million funding
- Create opportunities for others to add funds
- Consider GAC fee waiver recommendation
- Consider JAS Working Group advice
- Developing a “sustainable” support system before Round 1 applications open in January.

JAS Report Content

- In time for first round
- \$2MM to be administered via foundation
 - Reimburse applicant fees
 - Fund applicant infrastructure
- Fee reductions from \$185 K to \$47K (in addition)
- Staggered fees
- Applicant to pay back
- Relaxation of technical / operating req'ts
- Evaluation panel: mix of community and ICANN-hired experts

ALAC - GAC Report Content

- Governments should be able to participate
- \$2MM to fund applicant infrastructure
- Fee reductions to \$47K in addition
- In-kind support
- Applicant to pay back
- Relaxation of continuing operating instrument requirement
- Bundling IDN string requests

Challenges

- Difficult timing for first round
 - to solicit contributions
 - to set up foundation (bank account sufficient)
 - retain panel
- Applicant qualification based on need, serving public benefit
- Dealing with constrained resources
 - all qualified to some type support
 - most deserving of those receive financial support
- Perception: would not meaningfully, nor sustainably, support applicants

Batching

Subtitle

Considerations/Requirements

- Fair and objective for all potential applicants
- Comply with applicable laws
- Should be consistent with AGB
- Delegations must not exceed 1,000 per year
- Address potential abuses
- Makes sense: e.g., keep similar and identical strings in same batch

Possible approaches to:

- Reduce need for batching:
 - “Opt In/Opt Out”
 - Lengthen initial evaluation to accommodate more applications in one batch
- Batching:
 - Random selection
 - Secondary Time stamp
 - Charity auction

Integrated Issues Report

Two sections.

- Common issues across the cases studied
- Issues particular to specific cases

Integrated Issues Report

Also to provide:

- Roadmap that can be used for study and development of additional case study reports

Integrated Issues Report

Objectives:

- Identify the set of issues that require solutions for a common IDN variant TLD mechanism
- Identify any sets of issues to be solved for specific scripts
- Classify issues according to type (e.g., technical, policy, other) and priority

Integrated Issues Report

(Objectives):

- Identify appropriate groups/processes to resolve these issues
- Identify areas where further study is needed, if any
- Document the levels of support for conclusions

Integrated Issues Report

(Objectives):

- Document the analysis and rationale undertaken for conclusions reached
- Create “roadmap for additional cases”

Integrated Issues Report

Key Stakeholders:

- The ICANN Board of Directors and the Board Variants Working Group (BV-WG)
- Policy groups (including the GNSO, ccNSO) and advisory committees
- Potential TLD requestors/applicants

Integrated Issues Report

Working Practices:

- ICANN Project team staff will perform the drafting and editing
- The Coordination Team will have an advisory and reviewing role and liaise with the 6 case study teams

Integrated Issues Report

(Working Practices):

- The Community Wiki will be regularly updated with the relevant materials
<https://community.icann.org/display/VIP/Home>
- The Coordination Team will meet by teleconference - frequency to be determined by the Team

Integrated Issues Report

Proposed Timeline:

- 3 Oct 11: 6 Case Studies public comment period starts
- 22 Oct 11: Coordination Team meets in Dakar
- 14 Nov 11: Public comment closing date

Integrated Issues Report

(Proposed Timeline):

- 14 Nov 11: Case Study Teams begin analysis of comments. (Revised reports from the teams are not required)
- 28 Nov 11: Case Study Team analysis to ICANN.

Integrated Issues Report

(Proposed Timeline):

- 5 Dec 11: Draft Integrated Issues Report is circulated to team for review
- 15 Dec 11: Integrated Issues Report is posted for public comment

Integrated Issues Report

(Proposed Timeline):

- 30 Jan 12: Public comment period closes
- 20 Feb 12: Integrated Issues Report is published
- Mar 12: ICANN Board considers at ICANN Costa Rica
