 - Met over six months remotely and faceto-face
 - Two public meetings: ArabMIG Dubai and ICANN Beijing

 - Build strong and competitive domain name industry
 - Promote multi-stakeholder Internet Governance mechanisms
- Strategic Focus Areas:
 - DNS security and stability
 - Domain name industry
 - Internet Governance ecosystem
