How this effort started

- Registry Data Escrow is a key element of the registry continuity framework, aimed at ensuring registry operations continuity.
- During Seoul meeting, people from the gTLD community suggested to move the Data Escrow work on the new specification to the IETF.
- Others members of the ICANN community, including people from ccTLDs, gave positive feedback about the idea.



What is the Data Escrow effort in the IETF

- This effort in the IETF focus exclusively on the technical point of view of Data Escrow.
- The goal is to produce an specification that allows registry B to rebuild services previously offered by registry A with the minimal impact to registrars, registrants and end-users.
- The move to the IETF makes sense because it is a forum where more technical people from the Internet community would participate; giving a better specification as end-result.



What is NOT the Data Escrow effort in the IETF

This is NOT an invitation to do Data Escrow; but an invitation to those who care about it to participate in the effort.

■ There is **NO** intention whatsoever to delay the new gTLD program waiting for this spec to be finished.
