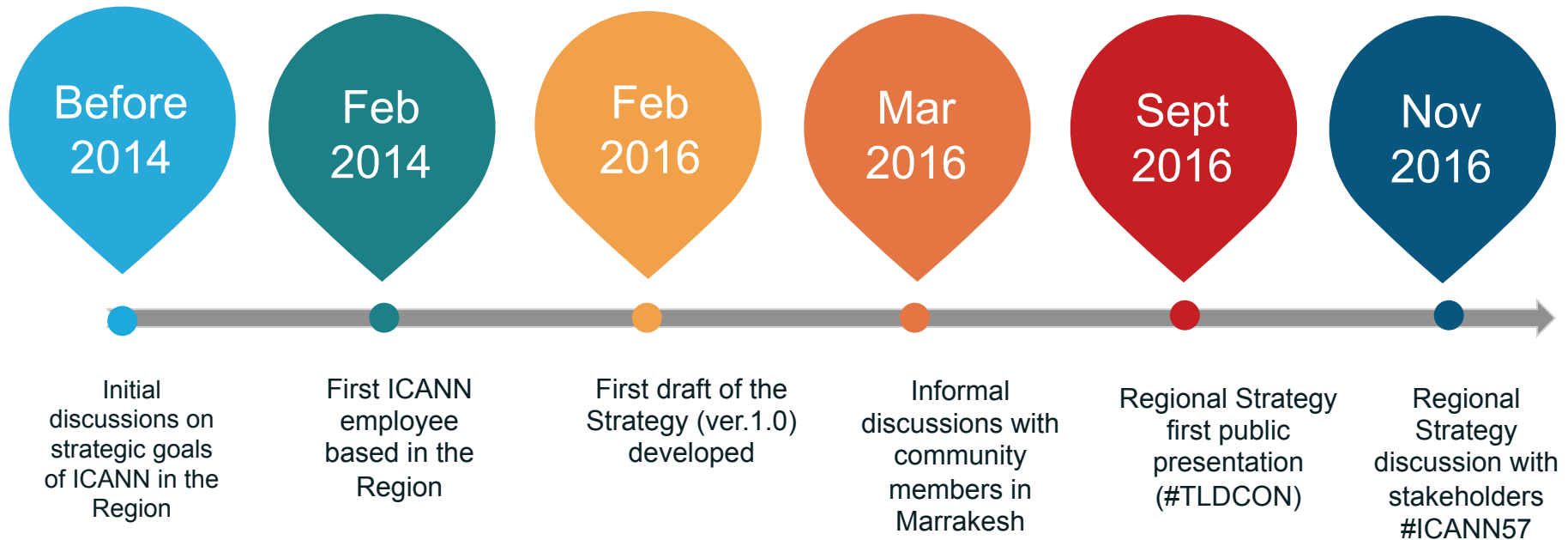
One strategy – 12 countries



Eastern Europe & Central Asia at a glimpse




- 12 countries: 1/7th of the Earth land surface and 11 time zones
- almost 300 million people total population
- 19 ccTLDs and 6 IDNs among them
- .ru is the 6th ccTLD in the world (amount of registrations)
- Russian language is the leading language of the web content and Cyrillic is the biggest and the fastest growing IDN script
- 4 L-root instances (2 in Ukraine, 2 in Russia) + 1 in negotiation in Russia,
- 11 countries are formally represented in the GAC
- 6 ccTLD operators are members of ccNSO
- Up till 2016 NO representatives from the Region in ICANN Board
- Summer 2016 Russian community member appointed to At-Large Advisory Committee Board

Focus on ICANN 5-Year Strategic Goals (FY16-FY20)

-  Further **globalize/internationalize** and **regionalize** ICANN functions
-  Bring ICANN to the world by creating a **balanced** and **proactive** approach to **regional engagement** with stakeholders
-  Support the evolution of the domain name marketplace to be **robust, stable and trusted**

Focus on ICANN 5-Year Strategic Goals (FY16-FY20) (2)

-  Encourage engagement with the existing **Internet governance ecosystem** at national, regional and global levels
-  Establish mechanisms to **increase trust within the ecosystem** rooted in the **public interest** and within **ICANN's remit**
-  **Empower current and new stakeholders** to fully participate in ICANN activities

Objective 1

ICANN as a trusted point of expertise for DNS functionality, stability, security and resiliency with respect to local context:

- Deliver first-hand timely update on ICANN activities
- Identify high interest topics for regional community members and offer relevant know-how and solutions
- Sustain and develop awareness raising and education efforts across stakeholder groups about ICANN, its mission and its activities

Objective 2

Focused and in-depth work with stakeholders to make engagement with ICANN mutually beneficial

- Integrate engagement strategies at the national level into regional confidence and capacity building
- Identify and elaborate on the most topical and regional-specific needs/consensual issues for engagement in the region/country
- Participate or assist in local expertise building on the topics in ICANN remit as a trusted partner
- Specifically encourage local technical community participation in global DNS industry and security development

1 Security, stability and resiliency
of the system of unique identifiers
(global Internet infrastructure)

2 DNS Industry:
prosperity for national economy

3 ICANN-related policy making process

- Facilitating few L-root instances installation
- Conducting new gTLDs briefings for local media
- Webinar updates (what would you like to be hearing about next time? Would you like to host it next time?)

Done with #IANA transition, what now?

- Looking for more engagement with academia (#MSU, MGIMO, Universities in Kiev, Minsk, Tbilisi etc.)
- KSK Rollover updates – watch the space in the next 1,5 years!
- Facilitating IDN label generation panels (Cyrillic, Georgian) work
- Growing more ICANN accredited registrars
- Promoting NextGen and Fellowship engagement
- There's more to be done...
