Motivation and Background

- Understand how accountability structures unfold in cyberspace
- Cyberspace governance is characterized by a multitude of actors, issue areas, and fora involved in processes of steering
- Accountability structures are often diffuse in settings of this nature

Research Questions

- **A:** Conceptually, what are the key accountability challenges confronting cyberspace governance?
- **B:** Employing an actor-based perspective, what types of accountability can emerge in the context of cyberspace governance?

A: Accountability Challenges

- The problem of many hands
- The profusion of issue areas
- The hybridity of institutional arrangements

B: Actor-Based Types of Accountability Emergent in Cyberspace Governance

- Hierarchical/state accountability
- Corporate/private sector accountability
- Collective/community accountability

Conclusion

- Cyberspace governance presents researchers and practitioners with tangled webs of accountability relationships of different texture and design
- Accountability structures are contested by the very elements that are constitutive of cyberspace governance
- Explicit and deliberate rehashing of accountability structures may be required
