
DPRD Scope

- Considering the broad nature of *the Public Interest*, and after reviewing initiatives currently undertaken by ICANN, the **Development and Public Responsibility Department** will *specifically focus* on promoting ***public responsibility*** both independently, and in collaboration with other international organizations and/or capacity building programs, through four initial key areas.

DPRD Purpose

- The **purpose** of the **DPRD** is to **streamline and formalize** ICANN's development and public responsibility efforts in **collaboration with regional teams and other ICANN Departments** so that we may **better serve and broaden the community**, and **facilitate participation through specific and measurable tracks**.

Current Work and Achievements of the DPRD

Localization and Language Services: Current Work

- A snapshot of the work Language Services currently carries out:
 - In July, Language Services translated almost 780,000 words requested by staff
 - At ICANN50, we provided interpretation to 90 sessions
 - Currently, we are running a focus group looking at content translation for the new ICANN.org



Education: Current Work



- Since starting in November 2013, the Online Learning Platform (OLP) **ICANN LEARN** has 27 courses- half of which were requested by the community.
- There are more than 900 monthly active users and 9,000 lessons viewed each month on ICANN Learn.
- In addition, DPRD conducts local Academic Outreach at our meetings

NextGen@ICANN

As of ICANN 51, there will be more than 75 NextGen@ICANN members

Fellowship

ICANN51 had 357 Applicants- highest number ever from 38 countries representing a diversity of sectors

Newcomers

Approx 200 participants at each Sunday welcome session at meetings and an average of 70 people a day at the ICANN Booth





