Overall time line

- Mar 2014: NTIA announced that it intends to transition its stewardship role of IANA functions to the global multistakeholder community.
- Jun 2014: IANA Stewardship Coordination Group (ICG) was formed
- Sep 2014: ICG called for proposals from various communities within ICANN
- Nov 2014: RIRs formed CRISP Team
- 19 Dec 2014, 8 Jan 2015: CRISP Team published drafts
- 15 Jan 2015: Proposal sent to ICG

CRISP Team composition

- 15 members: 3 from each RIR region
 - 2 community members, 1 staff member

Working method

- Input from the five RIR regions
 - Some regions had detailed proposals, others had only high level principles
- Reconcile differences, prepare draft
- Public comments, second draft
- Public comments, final proposal

Common elements from all RIRs

- No large changes to status quo
- ICANN to remain as IANA number services operator
 - But it must be possible to change in the future
- Service Level Agreement (SLA)

Non-common elements

- Affirmation of Commitments (AoC)
 - Proposed by APNIC and LACNIC
- Multi-stakeholder Oversight Numbers Council (MONC)
 - Proposed by LACNIC
 - Would be a permanent body within NRO
 - Decisions binding on ICANN

Resolution of differences

- Contract between RIRs and ICANN as the IANA Number Services Operator
 - Incorporates SLA
 - Removes need for separate AoC
- Review Committee
 - Compromise position, instead of MONC
 - Advises NRO/RIRs
 - Decisions not binding

Elements of final proposal

- ICANN to remain as operator, for the near future
- Contract between RIRs and operator
- SLA to be incorporated into contract
- Review committee
 - Monitor operator's performance
 - Advise NRO EC
- Intellectual property rights
 - (more detail later)

Intellectual property rights

- IANA trademark and IANA.ORG domain must be associated with the IANA function, not with a particular operator
 - Should preferably be transferred to a third party such as the IETF trust
- All public information will be in the public domain
- Any non-public information associated with registrations will belong to the RIRs, not the IANA operator

Next steps

- Consultation with IETF regarding IANA trademark and IANA.ORG domain
- Respond to any other issues raised by ICG
